

Nearly half (48%) of all children served by <i>Help Me Grow</i> will not need costly additional services due to accurate screening and targeted care coordination services.	49% of the children with reported learning environments were not attending a school or early education setting. These children may never attend a structured learning environment and therefore may not have had access to the services they received from <i>Help Me Grow</i> .	<i>Help Me Grow</i> continues to focus on serving <b>all</b> children, birth to eight, no matter where they learn or play. Help Me Grow <sup>®</sup> Florida is a comprehensive and integrated system designed to momote the healthy	development and well-being of all Florida's children age birth to eight, identify developmental and/or behavioral concerns, link families to community-based services and supports, and build collective impact amongst local communities. The services that children are able to access through <i>Help Me Grow's</i> early detection and intervention not only improves the	chances of a child developing to their full potential, but accrues economic gains for the State of Florida. <b>The Impact of Increased Funding -</b> A 2012 policy brief released by the Help Me Grow Maticual Center and Vale University estimated that	Help Me Grow saves up to \$2,300 per child through the elimination or reduction of specialist consultations and diagnostic testing costs. Increased funding would allow expansion into additional counties and create the capacity to	serve 69% more children per year. The 4,000+ families currently provided care coordination would continue to receive these	<ul> <li>* Help Me Grow care coordination is estimated to cut the long-term cost of early detection and intervention services by up to 46%, thus reducing dependence on State resources.</li> </ul>	Help Me Grow's ability to screen out children who do not need costly additional services directly reduces Medicaid costs. (72% of children screened by Help Me Grow are on Medicaid)	<ul> <li>\$26 million could be saved in state resources over the next three years if <b>all</b> of Florida's counties had access to <i>Help Me Grow</i>.</li> <li>Identifying issues early in life prevents expensive interventions in the future, prioritizes limited state</li> </ul>	<b>The Need</b> - Nationally, approximately one in six or about 13% of children have one or more developmental disabilities and fewer than 30% of children with developmental delays are identified before starting kindergarten, by which time opportunities for intervention may have been missed.	<b>5</b> 2% of the 5,060 developmental and behavioral screenings completed by <i>Help Me Grow</i> demonstrated concerns or a need for additional monitoring.
